- Provide general guidance for those seeking accommodation - where to go
- Do Thrive check
- Support general inquiries including visitors who may not be aware of UBC policy or disruptive, aggressive, or non-compliant behaviour - escalate to Campus Security as appropriate.

Health Ambassadors will also provide face coverings to those that do not have one.
